

Literacy and Reading

Read some stories set in Africa: **Handa's Surprise**, Meerkat Mail, All Aboard for the Bobo Road, One Day on our Blue Planet, The Enormous Crocodile

Find out about an **African country** of your choice. Create a booklet with information about the country!

Watch the story of **Handa's Surprise**. Use the **stick puppets** to retell the story. Can you write your own version using different fruits? Remember to think about the beginning, middle and end.

Africa is home to the Victoria Falls – imagine a waterfall – Write an **acrostic poem about waterfalls**. Remember each line must start with each letter of the word!

Understanding the World (Science, History and Geography)

Africa is the hottest continent in the world – and one of the hottest places is the Sahara desert! Find out about what life is like in the Sahara. Can you create your own desert information poster?
