	Use a variety of sentence lengths	Listen to the input on Microsoft Teams at 9:30am (you will receive a link in an email) or read through the literacy slides for Monday (found on the website).
Mon		Today we will explore the next scene in the book. Mind map some ideas of what has happened to the family's home. We will be writing short, effective sentences today (examples are on the slides) to use in our paragraph.
	Select appropriate vocabulary	Listen to the input on Microsoft Teams at 9:30am (you will receive a link in an email) or read through the literacy slides for Tuesday (found on the website).
Tues		Today we will explore the scene where the family return home. Note that the car is moving quickly and think about the emotions of the family members in the car. Contrast/compare these to the emotions the family are feeling stood in front of the house. You can use writing techniques of your choice, including emotion-adverbials and show not tell (examples on the slides). You could also use similes and metaphors if you like.
	Plan a narrative	Listen to the input on Microsoft Teams at 9:30am (you will receive a link in an email) or read through the literacy slides for Wednesday (found on the website).
Weds		Today you will write a <b>plan</b> for your own disaster story featuring a wildfire, blizzard or hurricane. The story should follow a similar structure to 'Flood' and feature a family who has to leave their home as they know a disaster is on the way. Use the <b>planning template</b> to help you.
LS	Write a narrative	Listen to the input on Microsoft Teams at 9:30am (you will receive a link in an email) or read through the literacy slides for Thursday (found on the website)
Thurs		Today you will begin writing your disaster narrative. You should write the opening (setting the scene, describing the characters) and the scene where the family make the decision to leave home when they find out a disaster is on the way.

	Write a narrative	Listen to the input on Microsoft Teams at 9:30am (you will receive a link in an email) or read through the literacy slides for Friday (found on the website)
Fri		Today you will write the second part of your disaster narrative. You should write about the scene where the disaster destroys the home; the scene where the family returns home and the ending of the story where the family re-build their home. Make sure when you have finished that you read through your work aloud (to check that it makes sense) and for punctuation and spelling mistakes.
