officers in your local **community**.






Police officers keep us all safe. They make sure that people obey the laws. They work with us to help make our communities safer.

For a police officer, every day is different. They have many kinds of jobs to do.





Police officers solve **crimes** and catch **criminals**. They also help out in different types of **emergencies**.

On duty

Police officers **patrol** the local **community**. People are less likely to break the law if there are police officers around.






Police officers get to know the people in their area. Knowing the community helps them do their job better.

Solving crimes

A **crime** is when someone breaks the **law**. A **criminal** might steal a car. He or she might break into houses to take things.






People call the police when something is stolen. The police do their best to find the criminal. They interview people and search for clues.

If there is an **emergency**, the police will come to help. It might be a road accident, or a fallen tree.






Police officers can give **first aid**.


They make sure people get help.

Police officers work at football matches, parades and other big events. They make sure everyone in the crowd stays safe.






Some police officers direct traffic.

They wear uniforms. They often wear high-vis jackets as well.






Police officers carry radios. They use them to talk to other police officers. They also carry tools such as **batons** and sprays to keep themselves safe.

high-vis jacket bright, reflective jacket that makes a person easy to see, even in the dark

patrol to guard an area by making regular trips through it

siren warning device that makes a loud noise

uniform special type of clothing worn by all members of a group, such as the police
