


Remind the children that tricky words are words that we have to know – we cannot sound them out.



## Write the grapheme



Normally oi is found in the middle of the word, oy at the end. There are some exceptions.



Splat the word – adult to say the word, child to find it

Splat the word! Sound talk the word and see whether the children can push the sounds together to read the word and then splat the correct word on the board.






Look at each of the words. Can you say the word? What sounds can you hear? Soil, destroy, coin, oyster, toy
