# Monday 1st March 2021 TBAT identify the features of suspenseful writing Features of suspenseful writing:

- Tense verbs (crept, tip-toed, shuddered, creaked, whispered) and adverbs (cautiously, slowly, quickly, gently, suddenly)
- Tense fronted adverbials Approaching the door,... Peering around the corner,... Slowly turning the key,...
- Onomatopoeia creak, clang, crackle, rattle, howl, flutter, screech
- O'Creepy' setting descriptions 'Strange carvings were crumbling away on the pillars on either side of her.'
- O Show, not tell 'His body trembled'
- O Ellipses ...
- O Short, shocking sentences 'She froze.
- O Figuartive Language Similes, metaphors and personification

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# Thursday 4th March 2021 TBAT use speech effectively in a narrative

To effectively build suspense and tension, we need to include the character's thoughts and feelings. We can do this in 3 ways:

- 1. Using adjectives to describe feelings (anxious, scared, frightened)
- 2. Use 'show, not tell' ("Shivers went down her spine...")
- 3. Have the character speak their mind: ("This is hopeless, I'll never find it!")

She makes the decision to look for her boat?

She leaves the Cathedral?

She hears voices nearby?

She is searching the shore?

To really 'up-level' our writing, we can combine speech, 'show, not tell' and the character's feelings into one or two sentences.

### For example:

"I'll never find it!" she whispered in desperation. She placed her head in her hands, this really was her only hope.
