



Help for Refugees from Ukraine

Please see this update from West-Sussex on support for refugees from the war in Ukraine seeking accommodation sponsors.

By way of background context in what is a rapidly evolving situation to complement the extended family visa scheme (which has removed a number of the previous thresholds for family members to arrive in the UK) the Government launched the <u>Homes for Ukraine scheme</u> on Monday 14 March. Ukrainians arriving in the UK under the scheme will be granted 3 years leave to remain, with entitlement to work, and access to benefits and public services.

Visa applications opened on Friday 18 March under this new scheme for Ukrainians and immediate family members who already have named people willing to sponsor them. Individuals or organisations (for example charity, business, community group) wanting to sponsor a Ukrainian individual or family can register their interest on the <u>Government portal.</u> This will enable a matching process to be completed, including vetting and security checks.

Sponsors are encouraged to make suitable accommodation available for as long as possible but for a minimum of 6 months and can be either residential rooms or unoccupied self-contained residential property. The County Council will provide wrap around support for individuals arriving from Ukraine via this route and there is a package of financial support to assist us and schools in this endeavour.

Since the formal launch of this new scheme a range of activity has been designed and implemented to deliver the requirements placed on Local Authorities under the scheme. The County Council has made contact with all those registered as Sponsors across the County and is now scheduling their respective property visit/check and undertaking the necessary DBS processes for each household.

We will provide our Admissions colleagues with as much early information on the number, age and geographical location of children who may arrive into West Sussex under this scheme but will be only completing applications once children have arrived in their sponsor household. We will complete these as In Year Applications and will support with interpreters, admissions paperwork, uniform provision, setting up initial visits and any other assistance to enable a smooth transition.

We would be keen for you to refer any direct contact from potential sponsors back to ourselves so that you are not overwhelmed and that we ensure fairness and equity in terms of access to places. The core email address is <u>ukrainesupport@westsussex.gov.uk</u> and is already receiving a steady stream of emails. We are able to answer the full range of questions via this route and will share updates with yourselves as more information becomes available.

We'll soon be launching an online contact form to signpost Sponsors to the relevant information, whilst ensuring our web page content is up to date as further guidance is provided.

We are incredibly grateful for the support that school families provide to refugee, migrant and asylum seeking children and know that you are keen to assist in this latest humanitarian effort. More news available soon.

COVID Information for Parents

Test and Self-Isolation



As of 1st April, government guidelines on the management of Covid-19 have radically altered, with significant reductions in all control measures. At Eastbrook, we continue to see many cases per week and want to protect our children the best we can. We are therefore keeping the previous measures until further notice.

The three main symptoms are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If your child tests positive on a Lateral Flow Device, but **are not displaying any symptoms** (asymptomatic), then they should still self isolate for five days. No PCR test needed.

When children reach day 6,of their isolation period, we still recommend taking a lateral flow test . If they receive a negative result on day 6 they can come back to school. However, it is important that they continue to remain cautious.

In School Measures

After Easter we will slightly relax in school measures for Breakfast Club and Skoolzout, but will continue to ventilate classrooms, remind children of hand hygiene and monitor all members of the school community for symptoms of Covid-19.

Eastbrook is now asking all staff to test if they develop symptoms, so that we can ensure we do not pass on Covid to children and any member of staff will observe a five day isolation. We will still fully support families who take measures to protect their child from infection and who choose to regularly test at home.

Please contact us if your child has tested positive so that we can let classes know when there is a case. Anyone who wants their child to wear a mask in school, please let the class teachers know, so that we can support them in class.

If your child tests positive for Covid-19—PLEASE DO NOT SEND THEM TO SCHOOI. Speak to us first.

Given the continued number of cases , measures will continue the same as those above after Easter and until further notice
