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Dear All

It feels like the term is already well under way. One of the ways we 'hook' children into their learning is through our WOW days. These often provide a chance for children (and staff) to dress

up and relive a different era. This week Year 6 have been evacuated to our old site in Fishersgate as part of their World War II topic. The children looked great in their old-fashioned clothes, clutching their gas masks and precious belongings. We'd like to take this opportunity to thank the parents who supported this learning experience. Other trips have been organised for different year groups as you can see in the diary section and on our website.

In this newsletter, we have also been able to share some stories about what our children have accomplished out of school. If you have anything to share please let the school office know.

We have had a positive start to the year with our attendance figure currently standing at 97%. It would be fantastic if we could all work together to try and beat our target of 96% for the year. We realise children are ill from time to time but it is so important that term time absence is kept to a minimum. Please remember that holidays cannot be authorised in term times and absences of over 10 sessions (5 days) may result in a fine being levied to both parents of each child who is absent.

Each year we ask parents/carers to complete a questionnaire in order to improve different aspects of the school. We were delighted to learn that 96% of parents would recommend the school to other parents, this compares to 86% nationally. Everyone was positive about the way the school is led and managed which was also great to hear. Full details will be shared on our website. We will also be organising our Parent/Carer forums across the year to ensure everyone has a chance to share their views and discuss a range of issues going forward.

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Attendance Update

Overall attendance is now very close to our target of 96%. We are however starting to get more requests for term time absences. We realise some absences are unavoidable but it would really help if families didn't book holidays in term time. We cannot authorise any holidays in term time as the expectation is that holidays are taken within the 13 weeks of holiday time across the school year.

In line with our locality schools we can only authorise exceptional absences such as **one day** for a close family wedding.

As you all know school attendance is incredibly important as it can have an impact on both your child's learning and their friendship groups. Our school target is to be at least in line with national figures: **96%; anything lower could have an impact on our Outstanding judgement.**

Each week classes have the opportunity to win attendance awards for the best attendance. Well done to the following classes:

Harvest Festival Donations

At this time of year we invite our pupils to bring donations in as part of our Harvest Festival celebrations. A separate letter will provide more details. The collection point is at the front entrance of the school for you to put your items in. The food and toiletries will then be sorted by Brighton and Hove Community Church and forwarded to the local Food Banks.

Coat Donations

The school is also supporting a local charity called Coats4Kids Shoreham. This was formed, two years ago, by some community leaders to pass on warm, waterproof and machine washable coats both second hand and new to children who need them most. The group consists of representatives from the Lions International, the Co-op Community Space, one of the local churches and a teacher.

Latest figures from the Child Poverty Action Group state that there were 4.1 million children living in poverty in the UK in 2017-18. That's 30 per cent of children, or nine in a classroom of 30

We are coming together as a community to help each other. Last year we gave out over 450 coats to families which needed them.

For us to be able to do this we would like to ask for any **coats**, **hats**, **gloves and scarves** that your child/children have grown out of that **are warm**, **waterproof and machine washable** to be donated to our school. We are collecting these items for 2 to 11 year olds.
