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#### **Attendance Update**

Overall attendance is now very close to our target of 96%. We are however starting to get more requests for term time absences. We realise some absences are unavoidable but it would really help if families didn't book holidays in term time. We cannot authorise any holidays in term time as the expectation is that holidays are taken within the 13 weeks of holiday time across the school year. In line with our locality schools we can only authorise exceptional absences such as **one day** for a close family wedding.

As you all know school attendance is incredibly important as it can have an impact on both your child's learning and their friendship groups. Our school target is to be at least in line with national figures: **96%**; anything lower could have an impact on our Outstanding judgement.

It was fantastic to see so many children enjoying their Christmas Dinner. Our kitchen team prepared approximately 350 meals from scratch with every potato peeled and every carrot scraped! The special Christmas biscuits were also homemade.

We are so lucky to have a chef in school preparing our food daily. If your child has not tried one of these meals it would be great if you could encourage them to give it a go; particularly in EYFS and KS1 where there is no cost to parents.



#### Costumes

We have had a fantastic idea from one of our parents to collect any costumes that children have outgrown to pass onto younger children in the school. This prevents on-going waste. We were thinking of Nativity, Christmas Jumpers, World Book Day and WOW day costumes, like the Egyptians or Bakers. If you have any costumes you would be prepared to donate to the school we will collect them in and then offer them to parents before performances, WOW days etc. If you have any such items please hand them into the office or your class teacher so that we can organise them appropriately. Many thanks.

#### **Playtimes**

As a school we are keen to ensure our children enjoy every part of the school day. To support pupils at less structured times of the day we have asked Mrs Groves to be our Play Lead. We have leaders for all of the different curriculum subjects (Miss Johnstone for instance is our PE lead and Mrs Green is our music lead) so it made sense for us to have a nominated play lead, particularly as children spend several hours a week on the playground. As we have mentioned previously, Mrs Groves is working hard to improve the school grounds, with additional trees to provide spaces on the field for children to play and access shade. She is also working improve the playground environment. KS2 playground has now been zoned with a range of activities available to children, including a sports area led by our PE technician, Mr Farthing, and a quiet zone. Older pupils also support younger children with their play.

Mrs Groves has started to contact local businesses for resources and Gardner & Scardifield Ltd responded immediately by offering sandbags to counterweight the basketball/netball stands. We'd

like to thank them for their support.

If anyone would be able to help us lay a short path to join one of our playgrounds to the main building we would really appreciate hearing from you. We are really keen to improve the school and would always welcome any help that can be offered.
